


- KCLS Manager's Report
 - Denise shared information on summer programming at the library including summer reading and author visits. The summer reading program is for all ages; there is more information at https://kcls.org/browse_program/summer-reading/
 - KCLS anticipates increased use of library facilities from the athletes, fans, and volunteers at local Special Olympics events.
 - The KCLS Foundation received a three-year, \$300,000 grant from the Moccasin Lake Foundation in support of IdeaX, including mobile programs and two Makerspaces. The first Makerspace opened in April at the Bellevue Library.
 - KCLS participated in the *Giving Care, Taking Care* conference on June 4 in Tukwila, sharing information on library resources that support family and community caregivers. The KCLS Foundation is funding self-care classes for family caregivers this fall, including at the Shoreline Library.
 - The KCLS Community Relations Department is working with KIRO radio on a podcast titled "People, Places, and Stories." Host and historian Feliks Banel will introduce listeners to people and groups in our region who make a difference through ideas, interaction, and information. The series will begin in July and run through December and will feature the Bellevue, Enumclaw, Kenmore, Muckleshoot, Renton, and Skyway libraries and their surrounding communities.  - KCLS is taking part in *A Passport to Washington Libraries*, a special project sponsored by the Washington Center for the Book. Participants can help create an interactive map of the libraries they visit around the state from June 15 to September 15 and enter a contest to win bookstore gift cards once they have visited at least five libraries, two of which must be more than 50 miles from their home.  - The Shoreline Library reopened on May 21 after its remodeling. Patrons have been enthusiastic about the new look; teenagers in particular appreciate the new area designated for them.
 - Naomi Fogerty has been named the new supervisor at the Lake Forest Park Library. She has been with KCLS for ten years, most recently at the Shoreline Library. Welcome, Naomi! We said farewell to Denise Bugallo as the regional manager for the Lake Forest

Park, Shoreline, and Richmond Beach libraries. She will transfer to the Northeast Region on July 23, 2018.

 - Shannon has arranged to have a family advocate from the Shoreline School District attend the author event in July. The advocate will share information on how the school district supports transgender students and their families. Either Shannon or Alexa will check with Robert Sindelar at Third Place Books to see if they have arranged for a representative from a transgender support group to staff an information table at the event.
