Mayor's Corner – Ballinger Way Road Work

Each year the City's Public Works Department contracts with King County for road overlay projects on city-owned streets. Last year we completed improvements to 35th Avenue NE from 40th Place NE to 190th Street, including a new pedestrian pathway along the west side, and new pavement markings throughout the corridor.

This year, the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) undertook filling in potholes and sealing cracks on Ballinger Way (SR 104), one of two state-owned highways in the city, Bothell Way (SR 522) being the other.

I am frustrated with the level of effort from the state related to its maintenance work on Ballinger Way. This is

far from the standard we expect on our city roads, and it is frustrating that the asphalt placed in the potholes was not made level with the road surface, resulting in a different kind of uneven surface for the public.

While we understand the state's desire to delay a complete overlay until after the city's 2024 construction of a roundabout at 40th Place NE and Ballinger Way, and the 2025 replacement of the state-owned culvert under Ballinger Way at 35th Avenue NE. We expect better maintenance of state roads through our city.

I want to let you know that we have heard and agree with your concerns. We will be letting the state know of our displeasure.

My thanks to those who reached out to us with concerns about the WSDOT projects on Ballinger Way. When we hear back from WSDOT, we will provide an update.

Lake Forest Park Tree Inventory Continues

The City of Lake Forest Park, with support from DCG/Watershed (formerly The Watershed Company), has embarked on an urban forest assessment. This study includes collecting data on trees within the City in parks and open spaces, along streets, and on private land. The data collected from this inventory provides critical information to help the City better understand and manage our community forest.



This is a communitywide effort! If you received an outreach letter and/or a 'door hanger' about the project, your property was identified as a potential data collection site, as part of a random sampling process. If you received

an outreach letter and/or 'door hanger' and have not yet responded, please use the QR code or link below to support this important effort. Once landowners have

given permission, an ISA Certified Arborist from DCG/Watershed will arrange for a site visit to evaluate your trees. We would greatly appreciate your support!

Locking Mailbox Program Starting Soon

The City will soon offer property owners the opportunity to purchase a locking mailbox at a discount for their homes. The City will be offering two mailbox sizes: small and large. The Lake Forest Park Rotary Club has offered to provide installation service for the mailboxes; or, they can be self-installed. Please be on the lookout for an upcoming news flash on the City's website with further information.



Rain is on the Way, Don't LEAF it to Chance!

The City works hard to keep the drains clear, but with close to 1,800, we could use your help by making sure the storm drains near your home remain clear. Please do not remove the grates from the drains as this creates a hazard and does not unclog the system. Instead, rake or blow the leaves away from the drain, but not back into the street. Help prevent minor flooding and big mud puddles by 1) mulching the leaves (adds organic nutrients to soils); 2) composting the leaves; or 3) picking up the leaves and placing them in yard waste

bins. *Remember, extra yard waste containers (one 96-gallon container + 3 paper yard waste bags) may be placed curbside for pick up each week.

NEVER try to clear a storm drain or culvert if there is moving water greater than ankle deep and always be wary of traffic when working near a roadway. Wet leaves are surprisingly heavy, so be careful not to overexert yourself. Debris from storm drains should be placed in yard waste containers. If flooding is severe or you find evidence of dumping, please call 206-368-5440.



Lake Forest Park Recreation Opportunities with the City of Shoreline



Are you a Lake Forest Park resident who is interested in recreation? You can take advantage of recreation programs offered through the City of Shoreline. Lake Forest Park residents are eligible for a 24-hour early registration period prior to the start of each season's programs plus an 8% discount on all program fees (not rentals) through the entire year! Fall early registration date has passed, but discounts still apply! To receive notices of the early registration dates, sign up for reminders through the City's

website [www.cityoflfp.gov], Facebook and Twitter or keep watch on the City of Shoreline's webpage.

The City offers scholarship reimbursements for eligible youth and specialized recreation participants who reside in the City and are registered for and attend cultural, recreation, or aquatic programs and camps.
