Meeting called to order by the chair at 7:05 p.m.

Minutes from the March 27, 2013 meeting were approved by email.

I. Business Partner Reports

a. KCLS: Denise

KCLS has a new free app to track your reading: Readometer.

A new staffing model will be coming to the cluster in January 2014. The model will harness the energy of librarians to do outreach activities. Other staff members (4 public service assistants, 2 full time, 2 more part time coming) are being trained to take over some of the in-library roles.

Deirdre Miller's new position will be Librarian Services Manager, and she will supervise all cluster librarians. She will be located at the Shoreline Library. An Operations Supervisor will be in charge at Lake Forest Park. The Operations Supervisor will supervise all library staff in a branch, a change from the way supervision is done currently.

Sabina Wagner, Managing Librarian at Shoreline will also have a new position as Supervising Librarian, and she will supervise all of the public service assistants.

Anina Sill, Richmond Beach Managing Librarian, will remain in the cluster and be a part of the management team..

Librarians will be getting out into the community and doing outreach to bring people not currently using the library in for programs and library services.

On the operations side: there will be substantial promotions for some staff (they will have either “manager” or “supervisor” in their title). These staff members were being underutilized under the current staffing model.

Planning for the new model will be taking place over the next six months.

Art in the Libraries: Shoreline Library gift funds (\$25,000) will be used for new art pieces. Shoreline’s art committee would like an outside sculpture at Shoreline. Julie Speidel, a Vashon Island sculptor, may have a piece.

A Lake Forest Park art committee is being formed to select an art piece for a wall in the children’s area. Rita Requa, LAC member, will be on the art committee.

Ros Bird, from the City of Shoreline, is locating venues for an August display of painted pianos. Richmond Beach and Shoreline are possible locations.

Many library programs have been scheduled this summer (see list in the attached Cluster Manager’s Report, below).

## II. Lake Forest Park-Shoreline Reads

### a. Updates, upcoming dates

The program is in full swing. Copies of *Where’d You Go, Bernadette?* are hard to keep on the shelf.

Two farmer’s market tables promoting the program and the library are scheduled: Shoreline farmer’s market on July 13 and Lake Forest Park farmer’s market on July 21. These market tables will be staffed by members of the Shoreline advisory board and the Lake Forest Park library committee respectively.

Joyce Woodbury will pick up materials for the Lake Forest Park market on Friday, July 19<sup>th</sup>.

Maria Semple’s author presentation is on July 29<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 p.m., on the Third Place Commons stage.
