What's Recyclable?

Summer is grilling, watermelon-dripping-down-your-arms, run-through-the-sprinklers season! It's also recycling season—because that's all year-round. Do you know what's recyclable at your summer gathering?



UTENSILS

Some utensils are made from corn or potato and are compostable. Plastic utensils are not recyclable, so trash them after you're finished.



PAPER PLATES

Once you use that plate for your hot dog that's slathered in ketchup and mustard, toss it in your organics cart. Food-contaminated paper isn't recyclable but can be composted.

PLASTIC CUPS

Sip the last of that refreshing cup of lemonade or soda pop, then toss your cup into the recycling cart. Remember, however, that foam cups are not recyclable.



ALUMINUM CANS

Did you know aluminum cans can be recycled over and over again? Be sure to keep the cycle going.



GLASS JARS

Finished with that last crunchy dill pickle? Toss the empty, clean and dry jar into your recycling cart.



PLASTIC BOTTLES

Whether it's a soda bottle or an empty ketchup bottle, it's recyclable! Just ensure it's empty, clean and dry before you toss it into your recycling cart.
