AUDIT SUMMARY

Results in brief

In the areas we audited, Transportation Benefit District operations complied with applicable requirements and provided adequate safeguarding of public resources. The Transportation Benefit District also complied with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures in the areas we examined.

About the audit

This report contains the results of our independent accountability audit of the City of Lake Forest Park Transportation Benefit District from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015.

Management is responsible for ensuring compliance and adequate safeguarding of public resources from fraud, loss or abuse. This includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal controls relevant to these objectives.

Our audit involved performing procedures to obtain evidence about the Transportation Benefit District's uses of public resources, compliance with state laws and regulations and its own policies and procedures, and internal controls over such matters.

In keeping with general auditing practices, we do not examine every transaction, activity or area. Instead, the areas examined were those representing the highest risk of fraud, loss, abuse, or noncompliance. The following areas were examined during this audit period:

- Dissolution/merger
- General disbursements
- Annual report
- License tab fee

INFORMATION ABOUT THE TRANSPORTATION BENEFIT DISTRICT

A transportation benefit district (TBD) is a quasi-municipal corporation and independent taxing district created for the sole purpose of funding transportation improvements within a district. A TBD is created by ordinance of legislative authority (county or city) and may include other counties, cities, port districts, or transit districts through inter-local agreements.

On October 23, 2008, the Lake Forest Park City Council adopted Ordinance 983, establishing the City of Lake Forest Park Transportation Benefit District, and adopted a new chapter to the Lake Forest Park Municipal Code, 12.35. The Transportation Benefit District had expenditures of \$207,289 for 2015.

Transportation Benefit District was dissolved and assumed by the City of Lake Forest Park on January 1, 2016.
